Jemez Principles

We discussed the Jemez Principles for Democratic Organizing. See attached to review. These principles were creating in Jemez, New Mexico on December 1996 as part of the environmental justice movement. Many within the environmental and climate justice movements use these principles to build strong, inclusive, accountable, and just movements.

Vision for Just Transition

We see solar as one solution to the climate crisis and inequality. We are working together to build a new industry in our state that puts people first and is built with the principles of equity, self-determination, and justice in mind.

- Host community events
- Host Climate and Coffee/Cocktails Conversations- connecting the dots between climate crisis and solar
- Engage people not as experts but as advocates
- > Educate business owners and local councils
- Connect with likely allies

What are we organizing for?

- To build a network of solar advocates and organizers to introduce and/or advocate for policies that advance solar
- Democratize cooperatives/run our own candidates for utility boards/public service commission
- > To create the kinds of cultural and behavioral change in our communities and individual lives that is in harmony with our ecosystem and our values of self-determination, fairness, equity, and sustainability.
- > To increase the number of locally owned solar businesses/cooperatives
- > To increase the number of rooftop solar installations
- To help people connect the dots between the environmental and climate injustices and solar as a solution
- > To build grass roots citizen power in our communities

Next Steps:

Steps Coalition will send out the notes and an online form for participants to identify specifically their priorities for policy advocacy and workforce/entrepreneurship.

Steps Coalition will also create a map of all the agencies and elected officials that influence the expansion of solar and start a list of allies and tools/resources.
